## Bishop's Easter Message

2026

To the beloved of the NWSWI,

Happy Easter to you as we celebrate the most sacred day of the year when Jesus squarely looked death in the face and overcame the grave! When I think about what that says about our God, I am continually overwhelmed by feelings of gratitude because of the sheer depth of God's love. To think about what Jesus went through in those final days, it is simply the best illustration of what God's grace looks like – a gift to us as individuals and as a family of faith – all without merit.

While on a Civil Rights pilgrimage last month, I found myself quite perplexed when listening to the central message of many civil rights leaders, including many that I met in person. While visiting Birmingham, I worshiped at the 16<sup>th</sup> St. Baptist Church, which was bombed on a Sunday morning just before worship on Sept. 15, 1963. Four young women (all teens) died in the blast as they were preparing to serve in the youth led service. As our group heard about the story in the tour the day before our worship, this central message was proclaimed – love. Later that day we spent time with another black leader in the city whose ancestors were also victims of white supremacy. She too acknowledged the central message that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. taught over and over in his messages – a message of love, even for your enemies.

That struck me. When victims of oppression look at their oppressors and can maintain a posture of love in hopes that the hatred they've experienced would someday be extinguished, I could only think about the depths of God's love. While most of us would at minimum defend ourselves from the oppressive actions taken against them, if not fight back and seek retribution, they instead turned to love and forgiveness. It is their faith in God that could give them the strength to practice love.

We still live in a world where hatred and prejudice exist. But the story of Easter is rooted in love. Jesus went to the cross after praying in the garden of Gethsemane, "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me, yet not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:42) Your will be done. This is true sacrifice rooted in love for humankind. This is love revealed to broken and sinful people. This is a love for us all – no exception.

As we celebrate the day Christ rose from the dead, offering forgiveness to all humankind, let us rejoice in acts of love. Let us respond to God's gift of grace through acts of love!

## Action Items:

- Discussion:
- ..We received two bids for an improved hearing aid system for the church. It will work with or without a wi-fi connection. We will also be able to use our existing devices. It will work with (t-coil) enabled hearing aids also. We approved the bid from "Sound Installations". This is the company that currently supports our entire sound system. The bid was for \$5,329. The source of the funding will be the new "Building and Cemetery Fund". The bid includes speakers by the bell for the ushers and one in the nursery. The approved bid will go to the Council for final approval.
- ..A rep from 24/7 met with committee members to discuss a security camera system for the church. The cameras would be placed both inside and outside the church. We will contact School District to see what they use at the schools.
- ..We have received permission to remove the fenceline at the cemetery by the adjacent landowner. The plan would be to remove the trees on the cemetery side of the fenceline and remove the fenceline. If this provides enough space we would move the road slightly. This is a long-term project but getting permission to take the fenceline out is a huge step forward. The road would eventually be paved. Council would still have to approve the project.
- ..The Altar Guild would like a new cabinet, sink, and countertop in the preparation area. The area will have new lights and paint also. The project specifications will be developed this week.
- ..A bid to install an improved emergency phone in the elevator was discussed. Randy Marlett and Dave Rollay are leading the project.
- ..We received a bid to fix four massive headstones at the cemetery. The bid is for \$1,810. The source of the funding will be the new "Building and Cemetery Fund". We have used this company in the past and we are happy with their work. The work would be completed by Labor Day.
- Completed:
- ..Aaron's annual evaluation was completed this month.
- ..A "cubby" system was built for upstairs for various supplies especially children's supplies.
- ..The church water supply was tested for lead. The concern was that the 73 year old pipes might contain lead. The test results were way below acceptable/legal limits.
- To be completed:
- .. A plan for replacing the trees that have been removed from the cemetery needs to be developed.
- ..Cork boards to be added to the "purple" room upstairs to display historic photos.

## LUTHER LOG
